## Newspaper Advisers 1897-1973

- While the **CARDINAL TIMES** has been a totally student-directed publication for 75 years, many faculty members provided the newspaper with guidance during that time. Between 1923 and 1937, numerous teachers volunteered their services to advise various departments of The Cardinal, with Miss Mabel Downs serving as supervisor until 1933. She was succeeded by Mrs. Mabel Southworth, a greatly loved and respected adviser who managed both newspaper and yearbook until 1948. Earlier records of faculty advisers are unavailable.
